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This morning we will complete our short consideration of spiritual gifts. Let us begin with our definition. A "Spiritual Gift" is a God-given enablement for ministry bestowed on the Believer at conversion for the building up of the church. These result solely from the sovereign work of the Holy Spirit.

But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. (Hebrews 3:13)
